LOOKES AVENUE, BALMAIN, IN 1866

Mrs Elizabeth Leyer, a descendant of Joseph Looke, boatbuilder and Balmain's first estate developer, sent this photograph from Kilkivan, Queensland.

The house at left is thought to be Looke's first weatherboard cottage of about 1840 (later replaced by a house built by his son William about 1868, now unrecognisable as 17 Lookes Av).

In the mid-ground is Looke's Cottage (later Radcliffe, now 15 Lookes Av), built by Looke by 1844 and possibly even earlier.

Looke's Cottage passed out of the family's hands in 1928 and soon after the roof was raised and the enclosed verandah added.

In the background is 11-13 Lookes Avenue, the nucleus of which was built by 1844. Only No 13 is still standing because No 11 was condemned by Leichhardt Council and purchased by it for demolition in 1968. A new house is being built on the site.

The 1983 Journal commemorates the centenary of Edmund Blacket, architect; Nicholson St Public School; Orange Grove Public School; and the Balmain Hospital.

Peter Reynolds concludes his article on the ups and downs in the history of the PEACOCK POINT PRECINCT.

In the second of his articles on the suburbanisation of Balmain, he writes of the destruction of the SIMMONS POINT PRECINCT by "slum clearance".

This precinct (from Darling St Wharf to Simmons Pt and from the waterfront up to Nicholson St) contained many historic buildings and saw the lives of its inhabitants come and go.

Balmain's first boatbuilder, William Howard lived where the flats, Gallimore Av now are. He won the first silver cup ever awarded for rowing in Australia in 1838.

Joseph Looke, in the following year founded a dynasty on land that now bears his name - Lookes

Avenue. His family lived there from 1839 to, at least, 1928.

Nicholson St Public School opened in 1884. The centenary dates from 1 January 1883 when the School was founded in the old St Mary's Church School, now 7 Adolphus St.

Its 100 years are celebrated in Larrikin Days, the centenary book by Annette O'Niell and Tony Stephens. The Journal article places the School firmly in the context of education in Balmain generally and in the historical development of the SIMMONS POINT PRECINCT.

The Leichhardt Historical Journal is now on sale at the Watch House, 179 Darling St, on Sundays, 2-4pm; at Joe and Josie's Balmain East Fruit Shop; and at the Australia's Heritage Bookshop, 87½ George St North (opposite The Rocks Visitors Centre)

The Australia's Heritage Bookshop is a treasure trove of Local and Australian history publications.
